### A Day in the Life of a Core Member - Intermediate Support Services

While you have probably seen our core members out and about in the community or you follow our social media pages and see all of the fun activities they participate in or the ways they volunteer, have you ever wondered what a typical day in the life of a core member might look like? Follow along as we learn how a core member receiving services in one of our intermediate homes might spend their days.

Our core member's home is typically staffed with in-person support staff every day of the week for only about 4-5 hours per day. When in-person staff support is not at the house, the core members here utilize a Night Owl Support System (NOSS). This system in simple terms is a Direct Support Professional, but virtual. The core members at this home can use their phones or a panel on the wall to call NOSS and are able to ask them any questions they have or set up a wake-up call if needed. Our core member will typically use NOSS when they are out and about in the community to ask questions that they may have about what to do if needed.

Our core member usually wakes up independently with their phone alarm around 8-9 a.m. After waking up, they will typically get ready for work or for whatever their day may include. Our core member works at a fast food restaurant in Ames Monday-Friday from 11a-3p. They will ride CyRide or HIRTA to and from work every day! Our core member also chooses to work at Hilton Coliseum collecting tickets for sporting events throughout the year when their schedule allows, also taking public transportation to these events! When our core member gets home from work, they usually choose to hang out with their housemates or spend time in their room playing video games or watching TV. Our core member cooks one night of the week for their house and typically enjoys doing this as they do great in the kitchen! Many of our core member's housemates and staff enjoy their cooking! After supper, they will clean the kitchen and choose to relax the rest of the night. On the nights that our core member doesn't cook, they will often complete their chore chart that includes vacuuming the floors, mopping, cleaning their room, cleaning the bathroom, and overall caring for their home. Our core member shares these chores with other members in the house and they take turns doing these chores throughout the week. Our core member will also work on their daily goals that have been personally created by them and their team to assist them in becoming more independent with daily life skills. Our core member enjoys working on these goals, knowing they will help them eventually move out into their own apartment!





Our intermediate support core members enjoy the increased independence and opportunity to learn new skills that this option provides them. And yes, some of them have been able to take the next step of moving into their own apartment this summer.

On the days and nights that our core member doesn't work or have anything going on, they will choose to participate in Friendship Ark's Day Habilitation program or Arc of Story County sporting events/Special Olympics. For the Arc and Special Olympics, our core member's favorite sports to participate in are basketball, bowling, swimming, track/field, and flag football! Our core member's favorite Friendship Ark Day Habilitation activities they like to go on are lowa Cubs baseball games, ISU men's and women's sports, and helping volunteer for different Friendship Ark events. Our core member is motivated to make every day great and we are very proud of the many ways they are learning and growing with the mix of independence and support that our intermediate home is providing for them.
